The CHILD Study is a national multidisciplinary, longitudinal, population-based birth-cohort study. CHILD examines gene-environment factors in relation to child's health and development, specifically in relation to allergy and asthma. We are seeking to recruit up to 2 Postdoctoral Fellows to help with the CHILD study 8-year visit and analyze data from the CHILD Study.

Duties and responsibilities

- Help complete the CHILD 8-year study protocol. Study procedures include:
 - Questionnaire completion with 8-year old children and their parents
 - Biological sample processing: stool, urine, blood, teeth
- Work closely with families and children in a clinic setting, research and clinic staff in a team -oriented research environment.
- Plan research activities, determine appropriate research methodologies and prepare protocols.
- Data analysis includes but not limited to data extraction
- Develop presentations to stakeholders including local and international scientific meetings, hospital collaborators, faculty supervisors.
- Prepare manuscripts for peer review publication.

Qualifications

- PhD in public health sciences, nursing, epidemiology or any other health service discipline
- Excellent written and oral communication skills in English
- Ability to work well in team setting
- Good organization skills
- Knowledge of STATA an asset
